



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **What are you doing about the pedestrian, snowmobile and off-highway vehicle crossing at Pittman Road?**

Our design can formally address only pedestrians and motor vehicles at this crossing. DOT&PF guidelines prohibit development of any dedicated snow machine or off highway vehicle pathways within the existing right of way. See Memorandum dated May 8, 2000 regarding Snow Machine & Off-Highway Vehicle Use of Rights of Way or more information on the laws and regulations pertaining to snow machine and off-highway vehicles.

### **It looks like you are extending frontage roads for only a small part of the corridor?**

The project as currently envisioned extends and connects existing frontage roads along the Parks Highway. The project does not extend frontage roads for the entire corridor because of impacts to private property owners and right-of-way acquisition costs.

### **What are you planning at Meadow Lakes Road?**

Meadow Lakes Loop Road intersection, as presently situated, will become a right-out only entrance to the Parks Highway with an indirect left turn provided with a u-turn at or near Marigold. The Meadow Lakes Loop Road intersection is too close to Pittman Road to add left turning capability. We recognize that a lot of traffic uses this entrance to the Parks Highway and are exploring several ideas for a safer intersection. Check with a team member for specifics.

### **When will you be acquiring right of way?**

At the current time, we don't know how much right of way will be required. Right of way acquisition begins when the design is well underway and right of way can be accurately defined—sometime after 2009. The acquisition process is constrained by federal requirements. Ask the project team for a booklet.
